

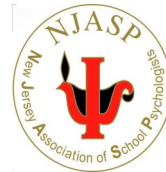
Graduate & Undergraduate Students Organization (GUSTO)

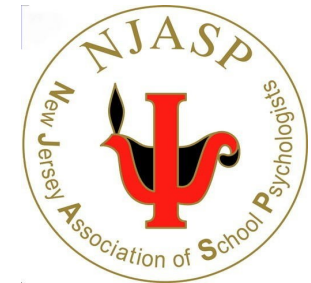

What is a School Psychologist?

School psychologists help children and youth succeed academically, socially, behaviorally, and emotionally. They collaborate with educators, parents, and other professionals to create safe, healthy, and supportive learning environments that strengthen connections between home, school, and the community for all students. School psychologists are highly trained in both psychology and education

What does a School Psychologist do?

School Psychologists Work with Students, Families, Teachers, Administrators and Community Providers to:

- Identify and address learning and behavior problems that interfere with school success
- Evaluate eligibility for special education services
- Support students' social, emotional, and behavioral health
- Teach parenting skills and enhance home-school collaboration
- Make referrals and help coordinate community support services
- Support effective individualized instruction
- Create positive classroom environments
- Motivate all students to engage in learning
- Implement school-wide prevention programs that help maintain positive school climates conducive to learning
- Promote school policies and practices that ensure the safety of all students by reducing school violence, bullying, and harassment
